## LITERACY NJ’S SERVICES ARE CRITICAL

Over one million NJ adults lack the literacy skills necessary to fill out forms, add numbers for a bank deposit slip, or read a medicine label.

More than 2 million residents of NJ speak a language other than English at home.

In NJ, over one million adults over the age of 25 do not have a high school diploma.

New Jersey’s adult education system relies on our programs to improve the basic skills of adults whose literacy levels are not high enough for classroom instruction.
